	A mum who didn't get their childs vaccinations done then became anxious it was too late – "I couldn't believe how welcoming the nurse was. She completely reassured me and walked me through everything. It was probably the best experience with a healthcare professional I'd had"	
	Using the Enhanced Access Service – These offer appointments outside of the surgeries normal working hours – "The service was ideal for me because it was during evening and weekends. I would recommend this to anyone. Staff are really helpful and have all the same information as my regular GP"	
	The PCN are looking to start a Patient Participation Group; They came to our meeting to see what we do and ask for support. Members are keen on attending PCN group and are willing to feedback to 42 Kingsway members.
